**STIPULATION
OF DEAUTHORIZATION**

WHEREAS, Respondent Chantal Hilaire is a physician licensed by the New York State Department of Education, license number 220001; and

WHEREAS, the attached Citation, dated April 30, 2013, was issued by the New York State Department of Financial Services ("DFS") and duly served upon Respondent at 15 Melton Drive, Rockville Centre, NY 11570 charging that Respondent has been found guilty of professional or other misconduct or incompetency in connection with medical services rendered under Article 51 of the Insurance Law ("Insurance Law"); and

WHEREAS, Respondent appeared for the hearing scheduled for June 11, 2013 at 10:00 A.M., which was adjourned by ALJ Kay Gardiner so DFS and Respondent could discuss a resolution to this matter; and

WHEREAS, Respondent has been advised and is aware of her statutory right to notice and a hearing on said charge and that if it is sustained upon hearing she will be deemed not authorized to demand or request payment for medical services in connection with any claim under Article 51 of the Insurance Law; and

WHEREAS, Respondent wishes to resolve this matter by entering into a Stipulation with DFS on the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth in lieu of proceeding with a hearing.

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY STIPULATED AND AGREED by and between the Respondent and DFS, subject to the approval of the Superintendent of Financial Services, as follows:

1. Respondent admits that on or about September 13, 2010 Respondent pled guilty to the crime of Grand Larceny in the 4th Degree (New York Penal Law Section 155.30), a class "E"

felony, before Justice R. Uviller in the Supreme Court of the State of New York, New York County, under Indictment Number 00843-2008. The aforementioned conviction was based on Respondent's criminal conduct in connection with medical services rendered under Article 51 of the Insurance Law.

2. On or about May 21, 2012, the State Board of Professional Medical Conduct of the New York State Department of Health found Respondent guilty of professional misconduct in connection with a Determination and Order issued under BPMC number 12-105. The aforementioned professional misconduct determination was based on Respondent's criminal conviction set forth in Paragraph 1. Respondent's license was suspended for a period of one year effective May 21, 2012.

3. Respondent, having consulted with counsel, hereby waives her right to further notice and a hearing on said charge and agrees to the terms of this Stipulation in lieu of any regulatory action which might be taken by DFS in consequence of the foregoing.

4. Respondent hereby acknowledges that as of the date of this Stipulation she shall not be authorized to demand, request, or make a claim for, and shall not demand, request, or make a claim for any payment in connection with any health or medical services rendered from July 11, 2013 through and including July 11, 2018 under Article 51 of the Insurance Law, and that such deauthorization shall have the same force and effect as if Respondent were deemed not authorized to demand or request payment for health or medical services under Article 51 of the Insurance Law following notice and a hearing on said charge, except that during such period of deauthorization Respondent may treat no-fault patients covered by Article 51 of the Insurance Law at any New York State Public Health Law Article 28 facility at which she is licensed to practice, and such Article 28 facility may demand, request or make a claim for payment for such treatment rendered. Nothing herein shall be construed to prohibit Respondent from collecting payments for health or medical services rendered prior to July 11, 2013 under Article 51 of the Insurance Law for which Respondent demanded or requested payment prior to the date of this Stipulation.

5. The proceeding commenced by the attached Citation is hereby resolved and discontinued by the DFS.
